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Sample Advocacy Day Student Trip Fact Sheet (Public Library)

Library Advocacy Day in Albany: Just the Facts

Wednesday, February 27, 2019

Each year, library advocates from across New York State converge on Albany to voice their support for funding and policies that benefit libraries. Their efforts have resulted in over \$11M in additional library aid since 2011. This is a great opportunity to see government in action, and have your voice heard about what the public library means to you! In past years NYLA (New York Library Association) has provided an opportunity for tours of the state capitol. If that is offered again, and we can make it work with bus timing, that will happen. We may also be able to ask Senator Robach to arrange a tour for us.

- 1. Cost and Transportation: The Monroe County Library System (MCLS) provides bus transportation to and from Albany on Feb. 27th at no charge. Snacks on the bus ride are provided. Teens will be expected to cover lunch estimate \$20 if purchased in Albany (or bring a lunch). The bus typically leaves the Rochester area at approximately 6 am usually in a central location like Henrietta. Teens are responsible for obtaining transportation to and from the bus pick up location.
- 2. Agenda (tentative): If all goes as planned, the bus will arrive in Albany around 10 am. Usually the buses drop library advocacy day attendees off one of the entrances to the Empire State Plaza and you walk to the Legislative Office Building (LOB). MCLS will have set up meetings with state legislators, in our case Senator Joe Robach and Assemblyman Peter Lawrence (or a member of their staff if they are called into session) and we will know those appointment times and locations in advance. These are sometimes before and sometimes after the big library rally in the "Well" of the Legislative Office Building that takes place at Noon. We plan on wearing matching tee shirts and making a sign for the rally! I would also like teens to write up brief statements on what the library has meant to them they may get a chance to tell their story to our legislators (time permitting). The Rally in the Well is where we really make an impact. Last year there were nearly 1,000 people there waving signs and expressing support for NYLA. NYLA invites influential legislators to speak (Speaker of the Assembly, Majority Leader of the Senate, etc.).
- 3. It will be a long day. Permission slips are in the works. Parents are responsible for notifying the school about the student's absence. Wear comfortable shoes!
